GAME SUMMARY

The Minnesota Vikings (6-6) hit the road for the first time since Week 10 when they travel to face the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (7-5) in Week 14. The game is scheduled to kick off at noon CT at Raymond James Stadium.

The Vikings defeated the Jaguars, 27-24, in overtime, while the Buccaneers had a bye week in Week 13.

Vikings RB Dalvin Cook is in the midst of a career year, leading the the NFL in scrimmage vards with 1,564 vards and scrimmage touchdowns with 14, both of which are career highs. With 1,250 rushing yards, Cook is second in the NFL and leads the NFL in rushing touchdowns (13) despite missing a game due to injury. Cook's 14 total touchdowns already tie him for 10th in a single season in team history.

LB Eric Wilson and Eric Kendricks are tied for the league lead in interceptions among all LBs in 2020 with three each, a career high for both. S Harrison Smith has a team-high four interceptions in 2020, tied for most in the NFC this season.

WR Adam Thielen has set a new career high with 12 receiving touchdowns this season, passing his previous best of nine in 2018. 11 of Thielen's 12 receiving touchdowns have come in the red zone, the most in the NFL in 2020. WR Justin Jefferson's 1,039 receiving yards leads all rookies in 2020. His receiving vardage total is already the second-most for a rookie in Vikings history trailing Randy Moss's 1,313 yards in 1998.

STAT OF THE WEEK



OB Kirk Cousins has recorded 21 games with at least 300 passing yards and at least three passing touchdowns, trailing only Dan Marino (26) for the most by a player in their first nine seasons. Drew Brees and Tony Romo each had 20 such games, while Aaron Rodgers had 19, in their first nine seasons.

NORSEMAN NOTEABLES

- Vikings WR Adam Thielen (380 career recentions) trails WR Sammy White (393 career receptions) by 13 receptions for eighth all-time in team history.
- S Harrison Smith has collected 27 career interceptions, including one in Week 13, the seventh-most in team history and tied for the third-most in the NFL since he entered the NFL in 2012. No safety has more interceptions, and only Richard Sherman (32) and Marcus Peters (30) have more interceptions than Smith in that same span.
- The Vikings defense has held opponents to a 36.4% success rate on third downs in 2020, the sixth-best mark in the NFL. Since 7 immer took over in 2014. the Vikings have had the best third down defense in the NFL with an allowed conversion rate of 35.3%.
- With a 75.0% red zone scoring rate, the Vikings offense ranks third in the NFL, trailing the Cardinals (75.61%) and Packers (75.56%).
- WR Adam Thielen has four games with at least two receiving touchdowns this season, the most in the NFL. Packers WR Davante Adams is second with three such games. Hall of Fame WR Cris Carter holds the Vikings record with seven games with multiple receiving touchdowns in 1995.

VIKINGS-BUCCANEERS CONNECTIONS

LOCAL CONNECTIONS

- Buccaneers WR Tyler Johnson starred at Minneapolis North, leading the Polars to an appearance in the Class A title game as a
 quarterback and defensive back. Johnson set numerous Gophers records in four seasons at the University of Minnesota, including
 career receiving yards (3,305) and touchdowns (33) before his selection in the fifth round.
- Tampa Bay T Joe Haeg is from Lake Shore, Minnesota, and attended Brainerd High School before playing at North Dakota State. **VIKINGS-BUCCANEERS CONNECTIONS**
- Buccaneers rookie safety Antoine Winfield, Jr., is the son of Vikings Legend, Antoine Winfield, who locked down the nickel
 position for the Vikings from 2004-12 and earned three consecutive trips to the Pro Bowl (2008-10).
- Vikings receivers coach Andrew Janocko began his NFL coaching career as an offensive assistant with the Buccaneers (2012-13).
- · Minnesota long snapper Andrew DePaola played his first three pro seasons (2014-16) for Tampa Bay.
- Buccaneers assistant coach Tom Moore was born in Owatonna and attended high school in Rochester. He worked two stints as
 Gophers offensive coordinator in the 1970s and was assistant head coach of the Vikings from 1990-93.
- Tampa Bay cornerbacks coach Kevin Ross guided the Vikings secondary from 2003-05.

PROFESSIONAL CONNECTIONS

- Vikings Head Coach Mike Zimmer overlapped in Dallas with Buccaneers Defensive Coordinator Todd Bowles and defensive line coach Kacy Rodgers.
- Bowles previously worked with Vikings tight ends coach Brian Pariani (49ers in 1991) and overlapped with Co-Defensive Coordinator Andre Patterson, Special Teams Coordinator Marwan Maalouf and running backs coach Kennedy Polamalu with the Browns a decade later.
- Rodgers played for the Steelers when Vikings Senior Defensive Assistant Dom Capers was with Pittsburgh. He overlapped as a
 coach in Dallas with Zimmer and in Miami with Maalouf.
- Maalouf and Vikings assistant defensive backs coach Roy Anderson worked with Tampa Bay Head Coach Bruce Arians and Assistant Head Coach/Run Game Coordinator Harold Goodwin in 2012 in Indianapolis.
- Maalouf and Anderson also worked with Buccaneers quarterbacks coach Clyde Christensen and offensive line coach Joe Gilbert
 while with the Colts. Maalouf and Christensen later worked together with Vikings defensive backs coach Daronte Jones while in
 Miami, overlapping with part of Bucs DT Ndamukong Suh's career. Suh was a teammate of Vikings QB Sean Mannion with the
 Rams in 2018
- · Capers and Tampa Bay Special Teams Coordinator Keith Armstrong worked together at the Dolphins.
- Polamalu's time with Jacksonville overlapped with part of Buccaneers Offensive Coordinator Byron Leftwich's career as a quarterback
- Tampa Bay specialists coach Chris Boniol played for the Cowboys during Zimmer's first three seasons in Dallas. Boniol helped coach Vikings kicker Dan Bailey in his first three pro seasons in Dallas (2011-13).
- Buccaneers LB Shaquil Barrett was previously with the Broncos, along with Vikings Offensive Coordinator Gary Kubiak, Offensive Line Coach/Run Game Coordinator Rick Dennison, Pariani, quarterbacks coach Klint Kubiak and assistant offensive line coach Phil Dauscher
- Dennison overlapped with Tampa Bay RB LeSean McCoy in Buffalo (2017) and DT Steve McLendon with the New York Jets (2018).
- Vikings WR Tajaé Sharpe and Bucs K Ryan Succop teamed together with the Titans. Succop also overlapped with Vikings Co-Defensive Coordinator Adam Zimmer when they were with the Chiefs.

The contest marks the franchise's fourth game played on a Friday (first since 2004) and the fourth overall matchup scheduled on Christmas Day (first since 2005), including a postseason loss to the Cowboys on Dec. 25, 1971.

The Vikings close out regular-season play on the road at Detroit for the first time since the 2010 season and the fifth overall time in franchise history, with the season-ending series split at 2-2. Minnesota's 42 points on the road against the Lions in Week 7 of the 2019 season marked the most at Detroit in franchise history.



In June 2020, the Minnesota Vikings and the Wilf family announced a \$5 million donation to social justice causes throughout the United States. Following the announcement, the team's social justice committee held a series of meetings to determine how to actively engage the community through player involvement and financial donations during the 2020 season. On September 8, the team announced nearly \$1 million will go toward the expansion or launch of multiple initiatives in one of three areas of focus: 1) voter education and registration; 2) educational curriculum on racism and Black history; and 3) law enforcement and criminal justice reform.



VOTER EDUCATION AND REGISTRATION AWARENESS

Working together with the Office of the Secretary of State, the Vikings are using the team's platform to encourage fans to register and safely participate in the electoral process. The Vikings will launch a series of player-led voting content and make it easy for fans to find voting information via Vikings.com/bethechange. The team will also help provide personal protective equipment (PPE) for polling workers throughout Minnesota. Additionally, the team has hosted voter educational sessions with the entire Vikings staff and players/coaches in conjunction with Rock the Vote and Secretary of State Steve Simon with the goal of having 100% of the organization registered to vote in the November election.

ALL SQUARE

The Vikings will further expand the team's commitment to <u>All Square</u>, a local nonprofit social enterprise that invests in the minds and lives of formerly incarcerated individuals. Centered on a craft grilled cheese restaurant, professional development institute, and forthcoming civil rights law firm, All Square's mission is to ensure that those impacted by the criminal justice system have the support and opportunities they deserve to become our country's future leaders, business owners, legal practitioners and entrepreneurs. The Vikings engagement will focus on All Square's Fellow & Fellow Alum Fund.

GEORGE FLOYD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In June, the Vikings created the George Floyd Legacy Scholarship with a \$125,000 endowment that will generate approximately \$5,000 annually to benefit African American graduating seniors in Minneapolis-St. Paul who are pursuing post-secondary education. The inaugural recipient, Mimi Kol-Balfour, was selected following her essay submission and was informed last week via videoconference by Vikings Owner/President Mark Wilf, General Manager Rick Spielman, running backs Alexander Mattison and Ameer Abdullah, and linebackers Anthony Barr and Eric Kendricks. Kol-Balfour is a graduate of Southwest High School who will be attending Barnard College this fall.

CRITICAL CONVERSATIONS

In partnership with <u>RISE</u> (Ross Initiative in Sports for Equality), the Vikings will host a series of Critical Conversation sessions with Minnesota High School athletic programs to help address issues of race and injustice. Vikings safety Anthony Harris and linebacker Anthony Barr spoke in August to a group of high school coaches to discuss the importance of having these conversations in a team environment. The program with RISE will further formalize the discussions and provide statewide access for Minnesota athletic programs to engage on these important issues.



306: BLACK HISTORY CURRICULUM EXPANSION

In 2016, with a focus on integrating Black history into mainstream U.S. history and developing courses devoted to the African American experience, the Vikings became the first NFL team to partner with Everfi in an effort to bring a 306 Black History curriculum to Minnesota students. The interactive course informs and inspires today's students through history's most important stories of Black women and men who overcame obstacles through grit, strength, creativity and intellect. The digital curriculum incorporates videos from Vikings Legends, provides direct source materials and allows students to explore and reflect on key themes of Black history. Now in its fifth year, the program has since been replicated by the NFL in many markets. In 2020, the Vikings will expand the curriculum from 12 to 24 schools and reach thousands of students.

PROIECT SUCCESS

In 2019, the Vikings partnered with <u>Project Success</u>, a Minneapolis-based organization focused on helping kids develop life-skills, support and confidence so they are more successful and engaged during high school and more prepared for life after graduation. The two organizations took 50 students of color from Minneapolis, along with Vikings running backs CJ Ham and Ameer Abdullah and safety Anthony Harris, to Washington, DC, for a special experience that included a visit to the National Museum of African American History & Culture. The trip was to be replicated in 2020, but due to COVID-19, this year's plan will be a day-long virtual experience and the Vikings and Project Success plan to return to DC in 2021.

VIKINGS SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

The Minnesota Vikings Social Justice Committee consists loosely of 10 members and any player or coach is free to join the meetings. Co-Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line Coach Andre Patterson has been part of the group, meeting regularly with Eric Kendricks, Anthony Barr, Alexander Mattison, Kirk Cousins, Kyle Rudolph, Ameer Abdullah. Adam Thielen. Anthony Harris and Harrison Smith on social justice initiatives.

Throughout the year, player-driven efforts strive to create meaningful dialogue and change in the community on issues related to building unity, hope and positive community relationships. The Vikings approach includes spending time with young people at schools, community organizations and juvenile detention centers and dedicating financial resources to organizations that work for positive change.

Over the previous two seasons, the Wilf family has made a \$500,000 commitment to the Social Justice Committee (\$250,000 each year). Those dollars were directed toward scholarships for low-income students, school supplies, legal aid for disadvantaged and underrepresented populations and law enforcement relations.

WILF FAMILY SURPASSES \$5 MILLION IN DONATIONS TO COVID-19 CAUSES

The Wilf family, owners of the Minnesota Vikings, have surpassed \$5 million in donations to COVID-19-related causes after their \$1 million contribution to United Way Worldwide, one of six national charitable organizations recommended by the NFL as part of its Draft-A-Thon fundraising campaign tied to this year's NFL Draft.

Through the Wilf Family Foundations and the Minnesota Vikings, the \$5 million in donations and commitments since the pandemic arose have been contributed in New York, New Jersey, Minnesota, across the United States and in Israel. These donations have supported health care workers, the elderly, food banks, social service organizations and Jewish philanthropic causes.

IEFFERSON DONATES FACE MASKS

Justin Jefferson teamed with Genies and Bella + Canvas to donate 10,000 masks to Children's Minnesota in June.

HUNTER, COOK DONATE MADDEN CHECKS

Danielle Hunter and Dalvin Cook announced in April that they each would donate their royalty checks from EA Sports for appearing in "Madden 20" to North Memorial Health Foundation so that doctors, nurses and other healthcare workers could purchase personal protective equipment.

THIELEN FOUNDATION DONATES \$25K

Adam Thielen and his wife, Caitlin, through the Thielen Foundation, donated \$25,000 to Second Harvest Heartland to help ensure that young people in local communities have the nutrition they need during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Thielen Foundation also partnered with KFAN 100.3-FM and iHeart Radio-Minneapolis in April for a Minnesota Covid Relief Virtual Radiothon that ran from 6 in the morning to 6:30 in the evening, raising more than \$280,000 for The Salvation Army, Second Harvest Heartland, M Health Fairview and MN Disaster Recovery Fund for Coronavirus

BARR PROVIDES EMERGENCY GRANTS

Through his Raise The Barr foundation (which focuses on helping single parents complete their postsecondary education), the Anthony Barr offered \$500 emergency grants to any current or former Raise The Barr scholarship recipients. In March, all 34 recipients who applied received the grant for a commitment of \$17,000 from the foundation.

UDOH DELIVERS FOR HEALTH CARE WORKERS

In May, Olisaemeka Udoh donated and delivered 500 meals to workers at Cape Fear Valley Medical Center in his hometown of Fayetteville, North Carolina.

He also made a donation to Second Harvest Food Bank to help families in North Carolina.

RUDOLPH LAUNCHES 'MEAL PLAN'

Kyle Rudolph and his wife Jordan made a personal donation to Second Harvest Heartland in March that provided 82,000 meals to Minnesotans who are being hit hardest by repercussions of the COVID-19 pandemic and school cancellations.

Rudolph also set a goal of raising \$200,000 for Second Harvest Heartland, which will provide 600,000 meals for local families. He set up the Rudy's Meal Plan campaign and encouraged whoever is able to join them in supporting the nonprofit.

Throughout the offseason, the tight end organized food drives for communities hardest hit by the pandemic and store closings in Minneapolis.

KENDRICKS DONATES PAINTING PROCEEDS

In March, Eric Kendricks announced that he would create paintings and sell them on Instagram, with the proceeds going to food banks in the city of the person who bought the painting.

Kendricks listed each painting at \$1,000, and then matched that price, with a total of \$2,000 going to each food bank.

VIKINGS YOUTH FOOTBALL

The Vikings Youth Football mission statement is to grow, support and promote youth football through fair play, health/safety and academics. Innovative programs reach youngsters through the High School Player Development 7-on-7 Tournament, Youth Football Camps, USA Football Coaching School, equipment and field grants, the Vikings All-State Football Team, Minnesota Mr. Football, the High School Coach of the Week Program and the High School Coach of the Year. In 2018 the Vikings started hosting high school games at TCO Stadium in the Vikings Prep Spotlight series, playing 5 regular season games and 3 state quarterfinal playoff contests since.

The Vikings connect with youth football programs across the state though clinics, camps and encouraging participation and safety. Teaching youth coaches proper techniques and how to play the game safely gives players the best chance for success and a positive experience. Head Coach Mike Zimmer has hosted an annual camp for youth, hosting over 500 youngsters at TCO Performance Center in spring 2019. Growing our great game at the grass roots level has been an emphasis for the organization, resulting in expanded programs, recognition for top players and coaches and building strong community bonds in youth football.

HAVE A SEAT AT OUR FAMILY TABLE

In June 2019, the Minnesota Vikings Foundation, in partnership with Xcel Energy, introduced Vikings Table, a custom-built food truck with the mission of serving healthy meals and nutritional education to youth across the Minneapolis-St. Paul community.

- The 38-foot, Winnebago truck is a zerowaste vehicle with energy star rated appliances and built-in solar panels.
- The kitchen is designed to hold 10 food preparation professionals, while the rear portion of the vehicle features an experiential room showcasing an 80-inch monitor that can display educational videos and nutritional information.
- Meals are served from June to December on a biweekly basis at schools, summer

- education programs, youth enrichment centers and other locations where childhood food insecurity is prevalent.
- Funds are raised by selling a separate full menu of food truck entrees twice a week at local food truck festivals, Vikings home games, training camp and other team events, as well as to the lunch crowd in downtown Minneapolis; 100 percent of the profits go back to distributing healthy meals to youth.
